Men's Swimming in Fifth Place at MCC's Heading Into Final Day

Flames fare well in 200-yard breaststroke, diving events

Cleveland, Ohio - The UIC men's swimming and diving team is in fifth place after day four of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Championships in Cleveland, Ohio. The fifth and final day of competition is on Sunday, Feb. 27.

The Flames received an outstanding performance in the 200-yard breaststroke, where UIC's Diego Lora-Coronado placed first in a time of 2:02.90 while teammate [Paul Torres](#) finished third in 2:05.38. Those finishes alone netted the Flames 36 points in the team standings, while [Eric Holton](#) and [Jim King](#) added 13 more points in the 200 breaststroke with 10th- and 11th- place finishes, respectively.

But UIC fared well in other events as well, with [Tom Schwingen](#) taking second in the 100-yard freestyle with a time of :45.66. Senior [Luis Bracamonte](#) also earned a runner-up finish, placing second in the 200-yard butterfly (1:52.47).

As usual, the Flames diving squad was in top shape, with Chuck Rock finishing second in the MCC with 437.20 points. Mike Magee also turned in a top-five finish, placing fifth with 396.20 points.
